Congestion/Air quality at Lane Head

LHSRG have had two recent meetings with TfGM to look at the issue of traffic at Lane Head. Meetings chaired by Andy Burnham and included James Grundy MP, Charlotte Nichols MP, Highways England, Wigan, St Helens and Warrington Councillors and Officers. TfGM are seeking to reduce congestion, traffic noise and pollution at Lane Head. Measures being considered by TfGM include a bypass extending the Atherleigh Way to Winwick Lane. Wigan Council have successfully applied to the Secretary of State for Transport to enforce "moving traffic offences." As a result Wigan will install an Automatic Number Plate Recognition camera on Winwick Lane in the new year. This will enable them to issue fines to drivers who break the speed limit or ignore the weight restriction of 7.5 ton.

106 Money

The proposed scheme to construct an extra left hand lane at A580/Newton Road still remains on the table. All four local resident groups have strongly objected on the grounds that the scheme does not mitigate against housing developments; it will be counterproductive encouraging more traffic and residents of the East Lancs Service Road were not consulted.

Lancashire Aero Club off Winwick Lane

The Planning Application for aircraft hangars (opposite Kenyon Hall Farm) was refused on appeal by H M Government Inspectorate.

Parkside Link Road Phases 1 and 2

The Link road is now well underway servicing 196 acres of warehousing. We are concerned that unless Warrington Council agree a weight restriction on Winwick Lane north-bound that even more traffic will divert from the site through Lane Head. TfGM are communicating with Warrington about the importance of a northbound weight restriction on Winwick Lane to reduce pollution.

M6 SMART Motorway construction

Residents of Newton Road/Winwick Lane have suffered over 100 nights of motorway diversions past their homes. Further closures will occur before the motorway construction is due to be completed in summer 2024. St Helens continue to refuse to divert motorway traffic through Newton le Willows via the A49.

New Community Noticeboard

National Highways agreed to purchase and install a noticeboard at the front of Lime House as a token gesture for night time traffic disruption through Lane Head.

Air Quality Winwick Lane

This remains a significant issue on Winwick Lane. NOx levels have increased from 44.6 ug/m3 in 2021 to 45.3ug/m3 in 2022. This, the 3rd highest level in Greater Manchester. Other NOx monitors in the area hremain less than the legal maximum of 40 ug/m3. Wigan have agreed to implement a 40mph speed limit from the end of the houses to the Warrington boundary (formerly de-restrict) in both directions.

Tunnel Tops/Kenyon Lane

The junction of Kenyon Lane/Wilton Lane has been the site of several accidents over many years. Wigan Council have installed a designated turn right lane.
